

WORKS-CITED LIST:

It is important to always cite your work.

1. Citations strengthen your argument.
2. Citations give credit where credit is due
3. You are just learning and not an expert, so more research is needed for you to understand!
4. Citations give credibility to you as a writer.
5. Citations allow your readers to research more about the topic.

There are several ways to cite your work:

APA format is the official style of the American Psychological Association (**APA**) and is commonly **used** to cite sources in psychology, education, and the social sciences.

MLA is the style preferred by the Modern Language Association, and it is **used** most often in the humanities, including literature, art, and theatre.
